In 2006, the federal budget deficit was \$248 billion. If everyone had paid the taxes they owed, there would have been no deficit at all, and the federal government in fact would have had a surplus of \$137 billion (Pizzigati, 2012). Despite the huge problem of tax evasion, budget cuts in 2011 weakened the ability of the IRS to enforce the tax code.

12.3 Problems in Work and the Economy - Social Problems

As Figure 15.1 "US General Fertility Rate, 1920-2010" indicates, the US general fertility rate has changed a lot since 1920, dropping from 101 (per 1,000 women aged 15-44) in 1920 to 70 in 1935, during the Great Depression, before rising afterward until 1955. (Note the very sharp increase from 1945 to 1955, as the post-World War II baby boom began.)
